

Deavron Dailey

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Summary

Mixed media artist, self-taught, working in fine art design, production, and curation/facilitation. What began with explorations of drawing and painting from a young age, developed over time into silk screen printing, ceramics, photography, and other forms of artistic media, in solo and collaborative works. Exhibitions have occurred in Pittsburgh and New York City. Public art commissions by invitation and by competitive selection in Pittsburgh. Curating work has focused on efforts to make visual art accessible to more people, both through physical art and online spaces.

Dear Miller St. mural selection panel,

I am a mixed media artist who uses a wide range of artistic media to create my artwork. I am constantly inspired by specific locations, architecture, and landscapes. I find great pleasure in determining which form of artistic media accurately depicts the mood, interest, or inspiration that was evoked within me.

I have close to 15 years of experience in professional art design, production, curating, and facilitating. 7 years of this experience includes artwork/art installations in the public realm. My projects have ranged in scale from medium to large. My "biggest" installation to date is a ceramic slab painting in a stainless steel "skeleton" or "grid." It consists of 128 handmade ceramic slabs that are 12"x12" each. It depicts nine raised fists in a range of colors over a painting of the map of the East Liberty community of Pittsburgh, PA. The painting is a tribute to the unity and resiliency of the community members when taking up the task of ensuring that the best interests of the community align with the endeavors of the community members, community stakeholders, and developers. "The Arms of East Liberty" had a budget of \$20,000. The artwork has resonated very well with the community and is another project that helps me realize how much of a positive impact public art has on our lives.

I am excited to hear of the Miller St. Baptist Church mural opportunity and submit the proposal of my concept design. The Miller Street mural is another opportunity to use my artistic abilities to commemorate important history as well as have a positive impact on our daily lives. As with "The Arms of East Liberty" I will create a vibrant mural for the Miller Street Baptist Church that will be informed by community engagement and the sharing of stories from Hill District residents of all ages. The concept provided is only a representation of my inspiration and direction, and not a final design. The artwork I will create for the Miller Street mural opportunity will be fabricated remotely on PolyTab and installed on the Miller Street Church building. The painting will take place in the studio workspace located in the Nafasi on Centre artist residency building (where I am entering my second year of a two-year artist residency in the Hill District not far from Miller Street Baptist Church). This will allow for great attention to detail, more safety, and community involvement. My experience coordinating large projects teams that include architects, engineers, fabricators, community organizations, etc. will ensure that I will deliver the Miller Street mural with great results, within budget, and on schedule with the projected timeline. If selected for this opportunity I will take great pleasure in enhancing my final design and will happily accept feedback that will be incorporated.



